Lowering Your Drug Costs



Connecticut | Massachusetts | Rhode Island | Vermont

There are programs to help people with limited resources pay for their drugs. These include "Extra Help" and State Pharmaceutical Assistance Programs.

Medicare's "Extra Help" Program

People with limited incomes may qualify for "Extra Help" to pay for their prescription drug costs. If you qualify, Medicare could pay up to 75% or more of your drug costs including monthly prescription drug premiums, annual deductibles, and coinsurance. Additionally, those who qualify will not have a coverage gap or late enrollment penalty. Many people are eligible and don't even know it.

State Pharmaceutical Assistance Program

Many states have programs called State Pharmaceutical Assistance Programs (SPAPs) that help people pay for prescription drugs based on their financial need, age, or medical condition. To learn more about the program, contact your State Health Insurance Assistance Program:

Other ways to lower your prescription drug costs

- Look into generic drugs. Ask your doctor if there are generics that will work as well as your current brand-name drugs.
- Ask your doctor about less expensive brand-name drugs.
- Consider using mail-order pharmacies.
- Find out if your state offers help paying for drug costs.
- Find out if the company that makes your drug offers help paying for it.
